

## Covid Regulations, August 23, 2022

Please note that the CDC regulations below continue to apply until further notice for general work environments. \*\*\*Schools are classed as crowded places.

Changes are expected to take effect from September 12th but do not yet apply.

**Beginning May 17** Testing will replace home isolation starting from May 17 to focus medical resources on those with moderate and severe symptoms; this new policy is applicable to staff working at key facilities and medical institutions and family members in the same household as confirmed cases.

**Confirmed Cases**  
The **7+7** program remains applicable  
(7 days of home isolation and 7 days of self-health management)

- ★ Family members in the same household who have received 3 shots **0+7 (no home isolation + 7 days of self-initiated epidemic prevention)**  
Those whose rapid tests come back negative can go to work and buy daily necessities. Going to crowded places or eating with others are not allowed.
- ★ Family members in the same household who have not received 3 shots **3+4 (3 days of home isolation and 4 days of self-initiated epidemic prevention)**

For schools, the regulations from the Education Department are that

1. if a student or teacher tests positive, the class must move to online learning for 3 days and every child must take a rapid antigen test. Students who test positive must stay home for one week and may not return to school until they have tested negative on a rapid antigen test. The test result must be photographed alongside the child's health card and emailed to the school nurse and appropriate department office.
2. Siblings of confirmed cases must also stay home for the same period and follow the same protocol.
3. Staff and their families follow the same regulations.
4. As a precautionary measure, non-fully vaccinated siblings of students who test negative but whose classes have been affected, may stay home for observation until their siblings return if their parents prefer. Assignments will be sent home for them and they will not be marked as absent.
